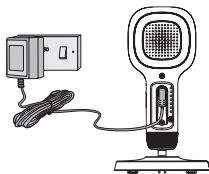


Warning - Strangulation Hazard -

Children have STRANGLED in cords. Always use protective covering when used within 1m of cot. Check before each use to ensure that the cord is not exposed to your child. Immediately discontinue use if protective covering is damaged or broken. Do not remove this tag.

2. Setting up your Digital Video Baby Monitor

2.1 Connecting the Power Supply for the Baby Unit

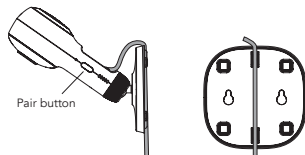


- Insert the DC plug of the power adaptor into the DC socket on the back of the Baby Unit.
- Connect the other end of the power adaptor to a suitable electrical outlet.
- The baby unit turns on and the power indicator lights in Green colour.

Note : Only use the supplied power adaptor (DC5V/1000mA).

2.2 Installing the camera mount on a wall

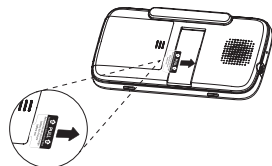
- Mark the position of the screw holes on the wall.
- Install wall anchors (Not provided) suitable for the wall type and mounting screws if needed.
- Fasten the mounting screws (Not provided) on the wall.
- Position the cable behind the base as shown in the picture before attaching the base on the wall.

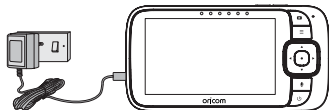


2.3 Connecting the Power Supply of the Parent Unit.

A rechargeable battery inside the Parent Unit allows the parent unit to be used when not plugged into mains power. We recommend charging for at least 4 hours before first use, and when the Parent Unit indicates the battery is low.

- Remove the pull tab from Parent Unit before use.





- Connect the USB-C plug of the power adaptor to the parent unit and the other end to mains power. Only use the supplied adaptor (DC5V/1500mA).
- Press and hold the  button to turn the Parent unit on, the Parent unit and Baby unit are automatically linked and ready to use.

NOTE:

When the Baby and Parent Units are both turned on and within range, the Parent Unit should show a colour image from the Baby Unit camera, but if the room is dark, the image will be in black and white, with an  icon showing the Baby Unit is in Night Vision mode. Unplug power adaptors when not in use, do not leave device on charge unattended.

C. Desktop Stand of the Parent Unit

- The parent unit comes with a desktop stand attached to the back.
- To use, simply pull out the stand, as shown.



Note: *Place the parent unit on a flat, even surface.*

3. Basic operation of the keys and display icons

	ON/OFF button	Press and hold to turn the Parent Unit ON/OFF.
	Vol+ and Vol- buttons	Press +/- to select volume level of the Parent Unit.
	UP/DOWN buttons	Press to tilt the camera up or down. (when in Zoom only) Press to adjust menu setting when menu is active.
	LEFT/RIGHT buttons	Press to pan the camera left or right. (when in Zoom only) Press to access menu options when menu is active.
	MENU button	Press to access or exit the menu.
	OK button	In menu mode, press to confirm a selection. When multiple cameras are paired to the parent unit, press to switch cameras, select camera scan or split screen viewing modes.
	VIDEO button	Press to turn the LCD screen ON/OFF. Audio will be active when the screen is off.
	TALK button	Press and hold to talk to your baby.
	RESET pin hole	Press and hold with a small pin to reset the unit.

	PAIR button	Press and hold to pair with the parent unit or HubbleClub for Partners App.

4. Important Safety Information

- Your Oricom baby monitor is designed to be an aid and should not be used as a substitute for responsible and proper adult supervision of a child.
- The baby monitor has been designed to provide some added reassurance in the form of video/sound transmission for those times when you are not in the same room as your baby provided you always stay within hearing range of the baby monitor during use.
- Your baby monitor is not a medical device, nor a device to prevent cases of Sudden Infant Death Syndrome (SIDS) or "cot death", and you should not rely on it for your baby's wellbeing. It is important that you regularly check on your baby personally.
- Make sure the baby unit, parent unit and mains adaptor cables are kept out of reach of your baby and other young children at all times, as far away from the baby as practical.
- Never place the baby unit or parent unit inside your baby's cot, bed or playpen.
- Never cover the parent or baby units with clothes, towels or blankets or any other item.
- Never use or place your parent or baby unit in or near moisture or water (e.g. near bath or pool). Immersing in water could cause electric shock and even death.
- The installation location plays an important role in ensuring proper operation. Therefore, maintain a distance of at least one metre from other electronic equipment, such as microwave ovens or Wi-Fi devices, otherwise they could cause interference.
- During continual use the baby unit power adaptors may become warm to the touch. This is normal and should not be a concern.
- This product is not a toy, do not allow children to play with this monitor.
- This device is designed for indoor use only.
- Unplug power adaptors when not in use, do not leave device on charge unattended.

5. Setting up the Camera Unit for Wi-Fi® internet viewing

5.1 Install HubbleClub for Partners App.



- Scan the QR code with your smart device and download HubbleClub for Partners App from the App Store for iOS devices or from the Google Play™ Store for Android™ devices.
- Install HubbleClub for Partners App on your device.

5.2 View on Compatible Smartphones and Tablets.



1. Open the HubbleClub for Partners App on your compatible smartphone or tablet.
2. Follow the in-app instructions to create your HubbleClub for partners account and connect to your device.

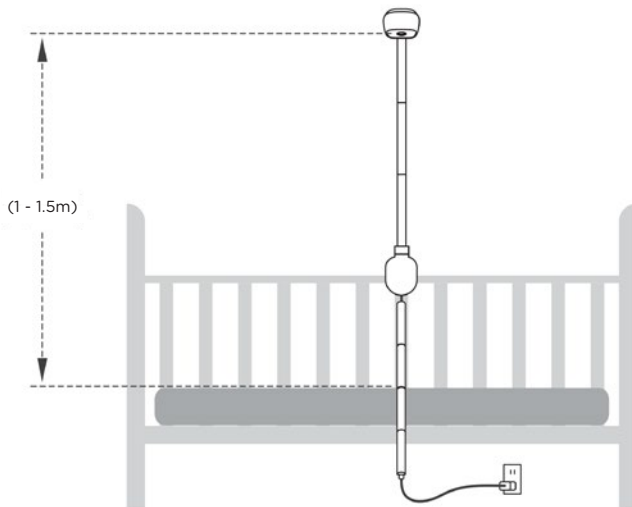

6. Installation of Cot Mount

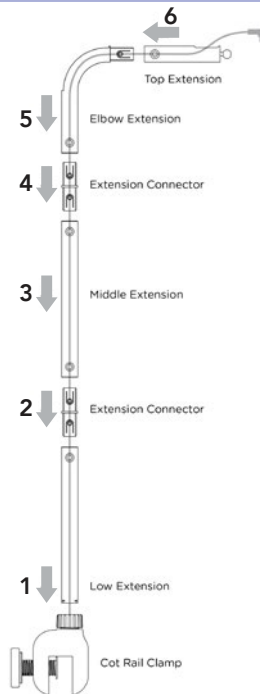
The model features advanced AI prediction algorithms so that unsafe sleep postures like when baby has their face covered or aren't on their back, are detected and you are alerted via the HubbleClub for Partners app.

For accurate detection and notification of all events, please mount the camera in a bird's eye view to oversee your baby at about 1 to 1.5m distance for optimal detection. See image below.



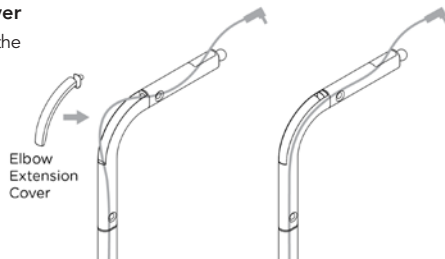
6.1 Assembling the Cot Mount

- Follow the number sequence to assemble the cot mount.
- Thread the power cable from the Cot Rail Clamp through all the Low Extensions, Extension Connectors, Middle Extension, Elbow Extension and Top Extension.
- Make sure the Extensions and Connectors are connected correctly, you should hear a click sound once installed together.



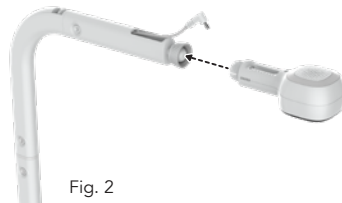
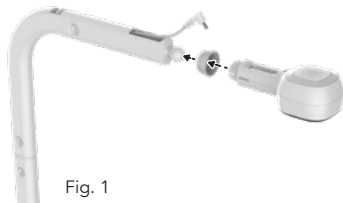
6.2 Close the Elbow Extension Cover

- Install the Elbow Extension Cover after the power cable is properly aligned.



6.3 Camera Installation

- Push the lock nut through the ball joint from the Top Extension.
- Push the chuck at the camera end to catch the ball joint from the Top Extension (fig. 1).
- Tighten the lock nut securely to hold the camera in place (fig.2).



6.4 Power Connection

- Insert the DC power plug into the camera's power socket. Refer to fig. 3 and 4.
- Any excess cable should be pushed back into the open slot.

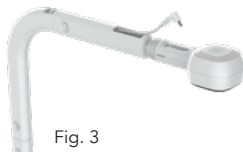

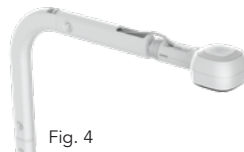
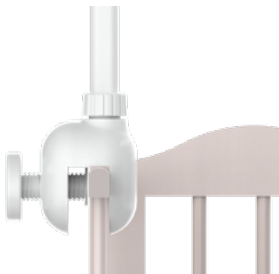

6.5 Cot Mounting options

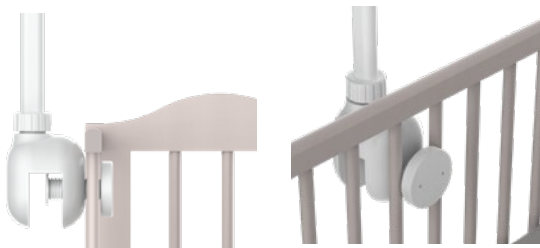
A. For top rail width less than 4.0cm (1.5")

- Place the Cot Rail Clamp on the top rail of the cot.
- Tighten the lock nut to securely clamp the cot mount to the rail.



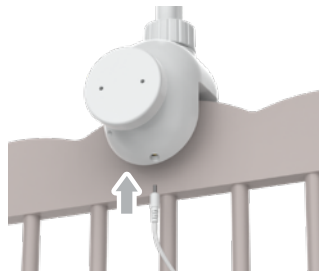
B. For top rail width wider than 4.0cm (1.5")

- Place the Cot Rail Clamp on the fencing with the lock nut inside the cot.
- Tighten the lock nut to securely clamp the cot mount against the slats.



6.6 Powering On

- Insert the round DC plug into the round socket at the bottom of the cot mount.
- Connect the power adaptor to a suitable power outlet.



6.7 Cable Covers application

- Use the cable covers to cover the power cable below the Cot Rail Clamp.
- Remove the cover first then align the cables inside the cover channels.
Reinstall the cover.
- Peel the backing tape off the cable covers.
- Press to stick the cable covers to the cot rails or tie the covers to the cot rails by cable tie (see fig. 7 and 8).

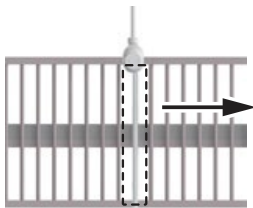

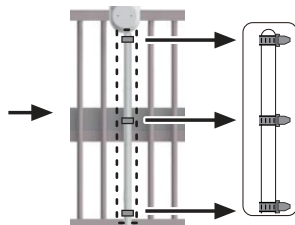
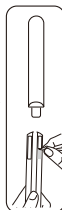

- Choking Hazard - Contains Small Parts. Keep children away from the installation area.
- Strangulation Hazard: The cable covers **MUST** be installed and be even with or extend below the bottom of the cot rails before use.

7. General Information

Express Warranty (Australia)

Our goods come with guarantees that cannot be excluded under the Australian Consumer Law. You are entitled to a replacement or refund for a major failure and compensation for any other reasonably foreseeable loss or damage. You are also entitled to have the goods repaired or replaced if the goods fail to be of acceptable quality and the failure does not amount to a major failure. In the event of a minor failure, Oricom reserves the right to choose to repair or replace the product.

The Express Warranty Period will be a period of 24 months beginning on the date of purchase of the product evidenced by your dated sales receipt. You are required to provide proof of purchase as a condition of receiving Express Warranty services.

You are entitled to a replacement product or repair of the product at our discretion according to the terms and conditions of this document if your product is found to be faulty within the Express Warranty Period. This Express Warranty extends to the original purchaser only and is not transferable.

Products distributed by Oricom are manufactured using new materials or new and used materials equivalent to new in performance and reliability. Spare parts may be new or equivalent to new. Spare parts are warranted to be free from defects in material or workmanship for thirty (30) days or for the remainder of the Express Warranty Period of the Oricom branded product in which they are installed,

whichever is longer. During the Express Warranty Period, Oricom will where possible repair and if not replace the faulty product or part thereof. All component parts removed under this Express Warranty become the property of Oricom. In the unlikely event that your Oricom product has a recurring failure, Oricom may always, subject to the Competition and Consumer Act 2010, at its discretion, elect to provide you with a replacement product of its choosing that is at least equivalent to your product in performance.

No change to the conditions of this Express Warranty is valid unless it is made in writing and signed by an authorised representative of Oricom.
